## 2.1 Licence Fee Recommendation Including Sea Run Salmon Endorsement Cost

R Gabrielsson gave background on outcomes of the first year for the sea run salmon endorsement licence. He stated the introduction of the endorsement had greatly assisted with managing the salmon fishery and said he would like to see a trial period for a further three years having a review date at that time to measure outcomes and review the season bag limit regime.

However, R Gabrielsson stated that the costs for producing the endorsement card was not sustainable for both the NCFG or CSI regions if they continue to pay for it (currently a three way share with NZC). The addition of the \$5.00 endorsement fee would go long way to paying for the production costs of endorsement cards and enable salmon monitoring for management of harvest and populations to continue.

Discussion took place on the timing for this increase, where possible further funding could come from and on the possibility of either region (CSI or NC) not agreeing to the \$5.00 increase when the other did.

#### Sea Run Salmon Endorsement Licence Fee \$5.00

That NCFG Council defer their preliminary decision not to approve the \$5.00 endorsement fee until consultation with CSI has been completed.

R Gabrielsson outlined the content of the annual consultation letter sent out by NZC to all Regional Councils for feedback on recommendations to approve licence fee increases.

Discussion focused on the late information received from NZC, and in particular the informal letter received by R Grubb (not dated or signed correctly) regarding the funding allocation for the Fish and Game review and the employment of a change review manager.



#### 2022/23 Adult Licence Fee

That the 2022/23 adult whole season sports fish licence fee is set at \$145 and that the adult who season game licence is set at \$107 (inclusive of the \$5.00 fee for the Game Bird Habitat Stamp), with all proportional changes to remaining licence fees and categories.

Cr Isitt Against Cr Musson did not vote.

R Gabrielsson raised his concern about the lack of consultation with professional fishing guides and regional councils, and highlighted that the proposed 'pro rate' increases to the non-resident

day licence categories may have unintended consequences. He suggested this increase be delayed as the timing for large increases to non-resident licence fees after two seasons without any international tourists may risk negative feedback and rejection of other essential licence fee increases.



#### Non Resident Licence Fee

That the adult non-resident is increased to \$250.00 and that the fee for the remaining non-resident categories be increased on the same ratio.

Cr's Isitt, Musson, Coster were against the motion.

R Gabrielsson commented that a payment from non-resident licence holders to pay \$50.00 to fish in designated waters needed to be carefully justified and along with any yet to be proposed framework on what rivers this would apply to.

It was suggested that the motion be supported but not designate any waterways in the NCFG region next season. Noted that the professional guides association would need to be consulted.



#### **Designated Waterways**

That the new licence category Designated Waters Licence is available as a free season endorsement to resident anglers and as a day licence to non-resident anglers at a fee of \$50.00 has merit but this option requires further investigation, so NCFG do not support the motion this year.

#### **CLARIFICATION OF COUNCIL DECISION:**

NCFG Council <u>did not</u> support the Designated Water Licence proposal sent out by NZC for regional consultation.

The NCFG Council recognized the approach may had some merit, but agreed that more work on this topic and management tool should be done by staff in the Pressure Sensitive Fisheries working group before NZC again circulate a revised proposal for Regional Feedback. It was identified that a framework for establishing and pricing Designated Waters would be required, and that consultation about this approach with the professional fishing guides association would be useful.

## 2.2 Regulation Setting Policy

The framework document wording be changed from "should" to "shall" as follows;

- regulations are to ensure our species are harvested sustainably by our licence holders;
- regulations shall promote participation by our licence holdes
- regulations shall be consistent with the ethics of F&G NZ
- · regulations shall be easily understood and clearly enforceable in Court
- regulations shall be legal, consistent with other related New Zealand legislation
- · regulations shall ensure all statutory obligations are met
- regulations shall be consistent with other F&G regions where possible

 regulations should consider the opinion and impacts of other statutory agencies like DoC, MFE and LINZ

Cr Barron stated this was a good framework that could possibly be used throughout the country.

#### 2.3 Sea Run Salmon Bag Limit

R Gabrielsson stated the salmon spawning count flights for 2022 were about half way completed, with good or better than average returns in all rivers except the Waimakariri River. However, because the Waimakariri River had a later run timing all survey flights were not due to be completed in late June. He stated that together with CSI both regions have agreed to use the last three years of salmon spawning escapement data, which includes using two full years and the best available estimate for the current years spawning number to guide decision making on any changes to the sea run salmon season bag limit. As outlined in the Adaptive Salmon Management regime agreed on between NC and CSI.

#### 4.1 Presentation from the Water and Wildlife Habitat Trust

M Patchett, Chairman of the Water and Wildlife Habitat Trust gave a presentation on the Trust's involvement on the Otukaikino river system and offered NCFG the opportunity to assist with;

- 1. joining the healthy waterways and catchment partnership:
- collaborate on heathy waterways advocacy and fundraising;
- 3. licence holders communications and awareness;
- 4. volunteers riparian plantings at Christchurch City Council events,
- 5. annual redds survey;
- 6. fishing popularity survey and access planning
- 7. research on fingerling survival, spawning enhancement and sand wand use;
- 8. assist to purchase a portion of wetland on Shipley's property.

#### 4.2 General Business

#### 1. Sustainable Fish Out Ponds in Christchurch.

Cr Coster stated that with the intention of increasing the numbers of junior anglers as well as strengthening participation in sport fishing, NCFG locate and develop a sustainable pond in close proximity to Christchurch with the involvement of key stakeholders.

#### 1. Salmon Smolt NZ Silverstream Salmon Hatchery Releases 2022

After reading his proposal, J Cumberpatch asked Council to consider the following recommendations listed below for the release of salmon smolt from the Silverstream hatchery to bolster numbers in the Waiamakriri River,

1. That NCFG Council acknowledge that the Salmon Smolt NZ (SSNZ) hatchery management is waiting the go ahead to supply significant numbers of juvenile [commercial origin] salmon for release at no cost, as part of their commitment to the local community.

- That NCFG Council request the Director General of MPI to permit the release of juvenile [commercial origin] salmon [smolt] from the (SSNZ) Silverstream hatchery to resume as soon as possible to maintain and enhance a future for North Canterbury's most popular sport fishery.
- 3. That NCFG Council receive this report and include this presentation in the minutes of the meeting.
- 4. That NCFG Council respond to these recommendations at the July 2022 Council meeting.

#### 2. Angler Fishing Days

L Burke (President NZSAA) was concerned that the number of [salmon] angler days fishing were getting less. This was possibly due to the 2 bag season limit with anglers waiting for the salmon run on the Waimakariri river. He stated there had been only one fish verified on the Kaiapoi River with 118 verified at the mouth of the Waimakariri. He also raised concerns that salmon were being netted in the Kaipoi River system, and that licence holder numbers would drop if fish numbers kept falling.
