## **Presentation of the Performance Report**

#### 1243 Underwood Property Acquisition

The Manager updated the Council on the Sale and Purchase agreement for the Underwood Property. The agreement has been signed by both parties and payment for the property will be made to the Underwoods just before Christmas. All legal titles for the boundary adjustments have been finalised. The Council will be vested and gazetted 44.2277 hectares as a Local Purpose Wildlife Management Reserve once the Underwood Property is transferred to the Crown. The Crown will invoice Northland Fish & Game for their agreed contribution when payment to the Underwoods has been completed.

## **Black Swan Meeting with NRC**

Field Officer, Nathan Burkepile, gave a brief account on a meeting he attended in Kaitaia on the impacts of Black Swan in the Far North. The Council questioned Nathan on various aspects of the meeting.

The Field Officer will be attending another meeting in the Far North with staff members of the Northland Regional Council, to visit farms which could have problems with Black Swan and to discuss any concerns by landowners on a farm by farm basis.

The Field Officer recommended that the Council write a letter to the CEO of the Northland Regional Council and ask whether the need for a cull on Black Swan in the Far North is their official position and if so, can the NRC provide sound science and legitimate concerns to justify such a cull.

It was moved:

That the Field Officer's Report on the "Impacts of Black Swan in the Far North" is accepted and the Council endorses the recommendations made in the report.

#### **Draft Game Season Recommendations for 2016**

The Council considered the Field Officer's recommendations for the 2016-2017 game bird season and whether the game bird season regulations should be set for three years. The Council decided not to set the regulations for three years as the Council does not change the bag limits and dates of the season very often.

After some discussion the Council made the following resolution:

It was moved:

That the Council accepts the daily bag limits as stated in the recommendations subject to the 2016 trend counts.

That the Council extend the dates of the season for the Grey/Mallard duck, Shoveler, Black Swan and Quail so that the season is the same length as previous years.

The Council agreed with the shooting hours and changed the Special Conditions slightly to the following:

#### 2 \* Definition of Area A

All lands north of a line running east/west, north of the Whangape Harbour, then along the main ridgeline of the Maungataniwha Range and out to and including all lands north of Whangaroa Harbour.

#### **3 Shooting Hours**

6.30am to 6.30pm, except the hunting of:

- a) Paradise Shelduck on 25 February and 26 February 2017, shooting hours will be from 6.00am to 8.00pm.
- b) Pukeko and Black Swan from 25 February to 5 March 2017, shooting hours will be from 6.00am to 8.00pm.

#### 4 Decoy Limit

No limit.

#### 5 Special Conditions

- 5.1 No person shall wilfully leave on the hunting ground any game bird(s) shot or parts of any game bird(s) shot.
- 5.2 Camouflaged Rowboats: Persons may hunt or kill game from an unmoored camouflaged rowboat.
- 5.3 During the 25 and 26 February 2017 special Paradise Shelduck weekend, no person shall hunt within 300 metres of any urban sewage oxidation ponds.
- 5.4 During the 25 February to 5 March 2017 special Pukeko and Black Swan season; no person shall hunt within 300 metres of any urban sewage oxidation ponds.

#### **NZFG** Council Meeting

Councillor Lynch, Noel Birchall and the Manager attended a NZFGC meeting in Hamilton on the 20<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2015. Councillor Lynch updated the Council on the following points:

- Environmental Scan. Parts of the country are heading towards another drought with low ground water being a major concern. Fish & Game will need to be vigilant regarding the protection of environmental flows.
- Research Projects Update. A template similar to the RM/Legal Update report should be introduced to help Councillors to understand each project's status.
- 2015 Regional Fish and Game Council Elections. Warwick Lampp, the Returning Officer, presented his report on the Fish & Game elections. This report provided a number of suggestions for improvement. The NZFG Council agreed that there needs to be a consistent approach on what is specified in candidate profiles. A template or policy would provide some guideline.
- Resource Management Legal Spending. Management of Fish & Game's legal expenses is defined by NZ Council policy but not by a national policy. NZFG Council made several proposals to the Review Committee to consider.
- MOU between NZFGC and NZ Professional Fishing Guides. The NZ Council accepted the MOU as amended by the Professional Fishing Guides as with the addition that the MOU is reviewed on a three yearly basis or at the request of either party.
- Legal opinion on dealing with donations and bequests to Fish & Game.

The Council thanked Councillor Lynch for his final NZ Fish & Game Council report.

## Reparations Policy Review

NZ Fish & Game Council has developed a national policy on reparation and asked all regions to consider this document. The Council discussed the document and agreed that reparation fees and possibly the purchase of a licence if the offender is unlicensed, is set by the regions.

It was moved:

That the Northland Fish & Game Council supports the draft
Reparation policy from the NZFG Council for adoption subject to
allowing regions to set their own reparation fees.
