Councillor Andrew Morris sought clarification as to whether an "oath of office" had been pursued by all appointees at NZ F&G Council meetings to abide by rules. Councillor Richard Moore indicated that it wasn't a formal requirement and was optional/voluntary.

Following a question from Councillor Duncan Thomas, Mr Teal clarified that the recommended limit for pheasants was unchanged from 2011/12 season - two cock birds per day per hunter.

Staff confirmed that following discussions with Ernslaw One staff that access for pheasant hunters would be for two months (until 26 June). It was noted that even though the sambar deer season was now open throughout the year, the forest was still balloted in an attempt to manage hunters. There were also plans to poison sites with ferratox within the forest from mid February to May.

7. <u>New Zealand Council Business</u>

Councillor Richard Moore presented an overview of the NZ Council meeting held on 3 February 2012.

He summarised that five guest speakers had attended the strategy workshop held in conjunction with the NZ F&G Council meeting:

- 1. Owen Cox (Federated Mountain Clubs) discussed issues of access, commercial interests, water, DOC funding, and treaty implications;
- 2. Kay Booth (Chair of Conservation Authority) lobbyist and advocate for recreation, had recently met with NZ Council CE;
- 3. Tony Ward-Holmes (Whitewater NZ) Health & Safety implications from farmers;
- 4. Gary Taylor (EDS) gave an overview of joint interests;
- 5. Mike Britton (Forest & Bird) natural ally

Richard Thompson facilitated a session on strategic planning – covering the topics of building visions, RMA reforms, better inter-Council communication, potential more frequent Chairmen meetings, compliance goals.

The Department of Conservation representative discussed the reparation alternatives to infringement notices.

It was confirmed that Otago Council had reaffirmed their appointee, and that Otago Council's appointee had also been sent a letter from NZ F&GC to abide by governance policy.

There was a motion to obtain information from Mai Chen on what instructions she had received from NZ Council regarding the CSI affair including (whom and when) and in particular instructions regarding lodging a complaint/report to the Ombudsman's Office regarding CSI F&G Region. Hamish Carnachan (Communications Manager, NZ Council) was thanked for his work in getting the new Fish & Game website on-line.

The Guide Licence was discussed with it noted that the Professional Fishing Guides Association are supportive of the NZ Council's approach agreed at the November 2011 meeting except using the Guides Licence as a restriction on guiding in certain areas. This had initially been proposed by West Coast appointee to deal with issues at a junior fishing area but it was resolved to remove that particular clause.

It was agreed that the Chairman send a letter to NZF&GC Chairman to seek clarification whether the guide licence will preclude private capture as was intended and if so how to deal with this issue.

There was still an issue of the penalty payment for late payment of levies for CSI region – which could be dealt with by leaving on the books as a liability for CSI region or reducing budget accordingly next year.

It was confirmed that the Chairman and CE had recently met with DOC officials to discuss relevant issues. The Chairman and CE had also met with their counterparts from Federated Farmers to discuss pertinent issues.

There were discussions on moving the meeting to starting on Saturday but was not pursued as it added significant costs for the meetings.

Councillor Andy Tannock asked for clarification as to the current status of the Mai Chen legal opinion on Conflicts of Interest and how they would be applied to NZ Councillors. This has not been released as NZF&GCouncillor Bates had recently responded to her initial report in a right of reply, but she had not yet responded.

8. <u>Review of NZ F&G Council Appointee</u>

Councillor Tim Allen commented that while Councillor Moore was doing a good job representing licenceholders interests, he considered the "us and them" mentality of factions in NZ Council was an unnecessary distraction. He considered that new blood could help refocus issues to core activities such

as research into mallard numbers. Councillor Tannock also reiterated that the aspirations of licenceholders were not being delivered on with the distractions at NZ F&G Council.

Chairman Taylor also said he did not want to see the divisions at NZC in Wellington and ask if any Councilor had been in touch with any other NZC about Wellington's representation on the NZC. Councillor Tim Allen acknowledged that he had been in contact with Mr Witherow.

Councillor Morris commented that although the appointee can vote as they see fit, it would be normal protocol to follow Wellington Council's views or positions. Chairman Taylor considered that NZ Council had two issues affecting the functionality on NZ Council yet to be resolved: issues around CSI region governance, and perceived or actual Conflicts of Interests. Councillor O'Meara considered that changing Wellington's appointee would make little difference.

9. Draft Game Season Condition Recommendations

Staff presented the results of the trend counts undertaken in January for paradise shelduck and black swan.

Mr Pilkington gave an explanation of the results for black swan counts and noted that as per Council policy adopted in the November 2011 Council meeting:

- 1) a "normal" season for Wellington East of 2 3 birds over the duration of the waterfowl season; and
- 2) a "liberal" season for Wellington West of 3+ birds for the duration of the waterfowl season.

After discussion it was moved that

The season conditions for black swan be as per recommendation and policy being a three (3) bird limit for black swan for the duration of the waterfowl season (8 weeks) over the Wellington Fish and Game region.

Mr Pilkington provided an explanation of the results from the paradise shelduck counts noting that Lake Wairarapa was significantly lower – which potentially may have been affected by helicopter cull operations. Chairman Taylor noted that Council had to consider the trends and make an appropriate management response.

A ten (10) bird limit per day be adopted for the waterfowl season (8 weeks) and special season with a five(5) bird limit for a twoweek period (3 weekends) in mid-February primarily to disperse the birds.

Mr Pilkington noted that although he had counted an extra 100 ponds, he found only 20 additional birds. It was agreed that staff would continue to look for additional moult sites.

It was noted from the previous meeting that it was anticipated that hunting could take place on Game Preserves for the month of April for a two year trial. Discussion ensued on how this would be made possible this year as other regional F&GCs were potentially using differing approaches to enable this. It was noted that the start of the season is recognised as the first Saturday in May.

After discussion Mr Teal was requested to write a letter to Rathmoy Game Preserve to encourage all hunters on Game Preserves to purchase a wholeseason licence.

10. Rangitikei River Access Update

In response to Councillor Allen's request, Mr Teal gave a brief overview of actions taken in the preceding year to resolve or investigate access restrictions in the Upper Rangitikei River. This involved involving the Walking Access Commission to negotiate access agreements with NZ Defence as a primary action, and gather intelligence regarding changes to access arrangements in the area.

Councilor Allen considered as we are unlikely to change the situation we should not spend time an effort trying to improve public access to this river and that there was no legal requirement for any landholders (including NZ Defence) to allow access to anglers on their land.

Chairman Taylor considered the legislative basis for maximising recreational opportunities meant that Council should still continue to seek improved access. Chairman Taylor noted that Bruce Bates (for Ngamatea Station) had responded to NZ F&G Council via letter which referred to designated camping areas – which required further clarification.

With the next meeting being in Wellington it was requested that Ric Cullinane (Operations Manager, Walking Access Commission) be invited to give an overview of progress made.

11. <u>One Plan Update</u>

Mr Teal noted that formal mediation had continued through until the end of October and considerable effort had been made to achieve outcomes that would avoid taking issues to the Environment Court. It was almost certain that aspects of the plan regarding sections of biodiversity, land use, and water quality will not be resolved and will be heard in March/April.

Mr Teal explained that there had been some difficulty in getting suitable experts prepared to act as technical experts that had the theoretical and practical technical knowledge, and prepared to present on agricultural industry issues.

Mr Teal noted that the recent announcement that Hawke's Bay, Horizons and Greater Wellington Regional Councils, and DOC to form a strategic alliance, only serves to highlight the importance of the precedent value of the One Plan.

The Environment Court has set the timetable for the Court Hearings (starting in March), as well as the expert causing and evidence exchange that are now standard practice prior to reaching Court. These timetables are tight which has required our evidence to be prepared over the late December and early January period.

Mr Teal confirmed that he had responded to the Federated Farmers requests for legal and planners costs relating to mediation.

Staff were requested to contact Paula Gillett to get facts on the access restriction and make an offer of trail camera which would be put in prior to the season until the end of the season.

Councillor Allen informed Council that he had spoken to DOC about spraying the willows in the wetland and that they had been positive after meeting with Nic Cudby. They were currently measuring up areas for spraying this year and it was agreed that Fish & Game reaffirm an offer of provision of spray and helicopter time which was budgeted.

6. <u>Matters Arising:</u>

Councillor Andrew Morris sought clarification as to whether an "oath of office" had been pursued by all appointees at NZ F&G Council meetings to abide by rules. Councillor Richard Moore indicated that it wasn't a formal requirement and was optional/voluntary.

Following a question from Councillor Duncan Thomas, Mr Teal clarified that the recommended limit for pheasants was unchanged from 2011/12 season - two cock birds per day per hunter.

Staff confirmed that following discussions with Ernslaw One staff that access for pheasant hunters would be for two months (until 26 June). It was noted that even though the sambar deer season was now open throughout the year, the forest was still balloted in an attempt to manage hunters. There were also plans to poison sites with ferratox within the forest from mid February to May.

7. <u>New Zealand Council Business</u>

Councillor Richard Moore presented an overview of the NZ Council meeting held on 3 February 2012.

He summarised that five guest speakers had attended the strategy workshop held in conjunction with the NZ F&G Council meeting:

- 1. Owen Cox (Federated Mountain Clubs) discussed issues of access, commercial interests, water, DOC funding, and treaty implications;
- 2. Kay Booth (Chair of Conservation Authority) lobbyist and advocate for recreation, had recently met with NZ Council CE;
- 3. Tony Ward-Holmes (Whitewater NZ) Health & Safety implications from farmers;
- 4. Gary Taylor (EDS) gave an overview of joint interests;
- 5. Mike Britton (Forest & Bird) natural ally

Richard Thompson facilitated a session on strategic planning – covering the topics of building visions, RMA reforms, better inter-Council communication, potential more frequent Chairmen meetings, compliance goals.

The Department of Conservation representative discussed the reparation alternatives to infringement notices.

It was confirmed that Otago Council had reaffirmed their appointee, and that Otago Council's appointee had also been sent a letter from NZ F&GC to abide by governance policy.

There was a motion to obtain information from Mai Chen on what instructions she had received from NZ Council regarding the CSI affair including (whom and when) and in particular instructions regarding lodging a complaint/report to the Ombudsman's Office regarding CSI F&G Region. Hamish Carnachan (Communications Manager, NZ Council) was thanked for his work in getting the new Fish & Game website on-line.

The Guide Licence was discussed with it noted that the Professional Fishing Guides Association are supportive of the NZ Council's approach agreed at the November 2011 meeting except using the Guides Licence as a restriction on guiding in certain areas. This had initially been proposed by West Coast appointee to deal with issues at a junior fishing area but it was resolved to remove that particular clause.

It was agreed that the Chairman send a letter to NZF&GC Chairman to seek clarification whether the guide licence will preclude private capture as was intended and if so how to deal with this issue.

There was still an issue of the penalty payment for late payment of levies for CSI region – which could be dealt with by leaving on the books as a liability for CSI region or reducing budget accordingly next year.

It was confirmed that the Chairman and CE had recently met with DOC officials to discuss relevant issues. The Chairman and CE had also met with their counterparts from Federated Farmers to discuss pertinent issues.

There were discussions on moving the meeting to starting on Saturday but was not pursued as it added significant costs for the meetings.

Councillor Andy Tannock asked for clarification as to the current status of the Mai Chen legal opinion on Conflicts of Interest and how they would be applied to NZ Councillors. This has not been released as NZF&GCouncillor Bates had recently responded to her initial report in a right of reply, but she had not yet responded.

It was then moved that

That the report from Councillor Moore on NZ Council Meeting held on 3 February 2012 be received

8. <u>Review of NZ F&G Council Appointee</u>

Councillor Tim Allen commented that while Councillor Moore was doing a good job representing licenceholders interests, he considered the "us and them" mentality of factions in NZ Council was an unnecessary distraction. He considered that new blood could help refocus issues to core activities such

as research into mallard numbers. Councillor Tannock also reiterated that the aspirations of licenceholders were not being delivered on with the distractions at NZ F&G Council.

Chairman Taylor also said he did not want to see the divisions at NZC in Wellington and ask if any Councilor had been in touch with any other NZC about Wellington's representation on the NZC. Councillor Tim Allen acknowledged that he had been in contact with Mr Witherow.

Councillor Morris commented that although the appointee can vote as they see fit, it would be normal protocol to follow Wellington Council's views or positions. Chairman Taylor considered that NZ Council had two issues affecting the functionality on NZ Council yet to be resolved: issues around CSI region governance, and perceived or actual Conflicts of Interests. Councillor O'Meara considered that changing Wellington's appointee would make little difference.

9. Draft Game Season Condition Recommendations

Staff presented the results of the trend counts undertaken in January for paradise shelduck and black swan.

Mr Pilkington gave an explanation of the results for black swan counts and noted that as per Council policy adopted in the November 2011 Council meeting:

- 1) a "normal" season for Wellington East of 2 3 birds over the duration of the waterfowl season; and
- 2) a "liberal" season for Wellington West of 3+ birds for the duration of the waterfowl season.

After discussion it was moved that

The season conditions for black swan be as per recommendation and policy being a three (3) bird limit for black swan for the duration of the waterfowl season (8 weeks) over the Wellington Fish and Game region.

Mr Pilkington provided an explanation of the results from the paradise shelduck counts noting that Lake Wairarapa was significantly lower – which potentially may have been affected by helicopter cull operations. Chairman Taylor noted that Council had to consider the trends and make an appropriate management response.

After discussion it was moved that

A ten (10) bird limit per day be adopted for the waterfowl season (8 weeks) and special season with a five(5) bird limit for a twoweek period (3 weekends) in mid-February primarily to disperse the birds.

Mr Pilkington noted that although he had counted an extra 100 ponds, he found only 20 additional birds. It was agreed that staff would continue to look for additional moult sites.

It was noted from the previous meeting that it was anticipated that hunting could take place on Game Preserves for the month of April for a two year trial. Discussion ensued on how this would be made possible this year as other regional F&GCs were potentially using differing approaches to enable this. It was noted that the start of the season is recognised as the first Saturday in May.

After discussion Mr Teal was requested to write a letter to Rathmoy Game Preserve to encourage all hunters on Game Preserves to purchase a wholeseason licence.

Councillor Neumann arrived at 5.00pm

10. Rangitikei River Access Update

In response to Councillor Allen's request, Mr Teal gave a brief overview of actions taken in the preceding year to resolve or investigate access restrictions in the Upper Rangitikei River. This involved involving the Walking Access Commission to negotiate access agreements with NZ Defence as a primary action, and gather intelligence regarding changes to access arrangements in the area.

Councilor Allen considered as we are unlikely to change the situation we should not spend time an effort trying to improve public access to this river and that there was no legal requirement for any landholders (including NZ Defence) to allow access to anglers on their land.

Chairman Taylor considered the legislative basis for maximising recreational opportunities meant that Council should still continue to seek improved access. Chairman Taylor noted that Bruce Bates (for Ngamatea Station) had responded to NZ F&G Council via letter which referred to designated camping areas – which required further clarification.

With the next meeting being in Wellington it was requested that Ric Cullinane (Operations Manager, Walking Access Commission) be invited to give an overview of progress made.

11. <u>One Plan Update</u>

Mr Teal noted that formal mediation had continued through until the end of October and considerable effort had been made to achieve outcomes that would avoid taking issues to the Environment Court. It was almost certain that aspects of the plan regarding sections of biodiversity, land use, and water quality will not be resolved and will be heard in March/April.

Mr Teal explained that there had been some difficulty in getting suitable experts prepared to act as technical experts that had the theoretical and practical technical knowledge, and prepared to present on agricultural industry issues.

Mr Teal noted that the recent announcement that Hawke's Bay, Horizons and Greater Wellington Regional Councils, and DOC to form a strategic alliance, only serves to highlight the importance of the precedent value of the One Plan.

The Environment Court has set the timetable for the Court Hearings (starting in March), as well as the expert causing and evidence exchange that are now standard practice prior to reaching Court. These timetables are tight which has required our evidence to be prepared over the late December and early January period.

Mr Teal confirmed that he had responded to the Federated Farmers requests for legal and planners costs relating to mediation.

It was noted that the gate was locked on the access to JK Donald Wetland with it being inferred that this occurred due to concern of potential interference of the helicopter goose cull. Potential actions were discussed including issuance of coded padlock, or a trail camera which could be managed by F&G and/or Paula Gillett – noting that the car registration numbers must match, and informing Spot-X that a more restrictive note be given for that access point.

Staff were requested to contact Paula Gillett to get facts on the access restriction and make an offer of trail camera which would be put in prior to the season until the end of the season.

Councillor Allen informed Council that he had spoken to DOC about spraying the willows in the wetland and that they had been positive after meeting with Nic Cudby. They were currently measuring up areas for spraying this year and it was agreed that Fish & Game reaffirm an offer of provision of spray and helicopter time which was budgeted.

It had been reported that a causeway had been constructed between Matthews Lagoon and Boggy Pond and the culvert removed. It was confirmed that Fish & Game had offered to assist with this project but had not subsequently been approached.

While the weir boards have not been installed in December, there was high water levels reported throughout summer – which resulted in extensive waterfowl use. There was a request to install the weir boards with a view to maintain water levels from February until May.

Mr Teal confirmed that there were two sites being balloted for the Wairarapa area in mid February, along with several in Pukepuke Lagoon, Himatangi.

Fishing and Hunting Internet Forum

Councillor O'Meara had been made aware that comments had been made on an internet discussion group forum regarding decisions at a previous Council meeting. He considered that Councillor Allen had made what he regarded as derogatory comments on how Councillors had voted.

Chairman Taylor indicated that a decision had been made at that meeting where one resolution was lost and a subsequent resolution carried and accepted. Councillor Moore noted that Councillors should take collective responsibility for decisions made.

There were also plans to poison sites with ferratox within the forest from mid February to May.

7. <u>New Zealand Council Business</u>

Councillor Richard Moore presented an overview of the NZ Council meeting held on 3 February 2012.

He summarised that five guest speakers had attended the strategy workshop held in conjunction with the NZ F&G Council meeting:

- 1. Owen Cox (Federated Mountain Clubs) discussed issues of access, commercial interests, water, DOC funding, and treaty implications;
- 2. Kay Booth (Chair of Conservation Authority) lobbyist and advocate for recreation, had recently met with NZ Council CE;
- 3. Tony Ward-Holmes (Whitewater NZ) Health & Safety implications from farmers;
- 4. Gary Taylor (EDS) gave an overview of joint interests;
- 5. Mike Britton (Forest & Bird) natural ally

Richard Thompson facilitated a session on strategic planning – covering the topics of building visions, RMA reforms, better inter-Council communication, potential more frequent Chairmen meetings, compliance goals.

The Department of Conservation representative discussed the reparation alternatives to infringement notices.

It was confirmed that Otago Council had reaffirmed their appointee, and that Otago Council's appointee had also been sent a letter from NZ F&GC to abide by governance policy.

There was a motion to obtain information from Mai Chen on what instructions she had received from NZ Council regarding the CSI affair including (whom and when) and in particular instructions regarding lodging a complaint/report to the Ombudsman's Office regarding CSI F&G Region. Hamish Carnachan (Communications Manager, NZ Council) was thanked for his work in getting the new Fish & Game website on-line.

The Guide Licence was discussed with it noted that the Professional Fishing Guides Association are supportive of the NZ Council's approach agreed at the November 2011 meeting except using the Guides Licence as a restriction on guiding in certain areas. This had initially been proposed by West Coast appointee to deal with issues at a junior fishing area but it was resolved to remove that particular clause.

It was agreed that the Chairman send a letter to NZF&GC Chairman to seek clarification whether the guide licence will preclude private capture as was intended and if so how to deal with this issue.

There was still an issue of the penalty payment for late payment of levies for CSI region – which could be dealt with by leaving on the books as a liability for CSI region or reducing budget accordingly next year.

8. <u>Review of NZ F&G Council Appointee</u>

- 1) a "normal" season for Wellington East of 2 3 birds over the duration of the waterfowl season; and
- 2) a "liberal" season for Wellington West of 3+ birds for the duration of the waterfowl season.

The season conditions for black swan be as per recommendation and policy being a three (3) bird limit for black swan for the duration of the waterfowl season (8 weeks) over the Wellington Fish and Game region.

Mr Pilkington provided an explanation of the results from the paradise shelduck counts noting that Lake Wairarapa was significantly lower – which potentially may have been affected by helicopter cull operations. Chairman Taylor noted that Council had to consider the trends and make an appropriate management response.

A ten (10) bird limit per day be adopted for the waterfowl season (8 weeks) and special season with a five(5) bird limit for a twoweek period (3 weekends) in mid-February primarily to disperse the birds.

Mr Pilkington noted that although he had counted an extra 100 ponds, he found only 20 additional birds. It was agreed that staff would continue to look for additional moult sites.

It was noted from the previous meeting that it was anticipated that hunting could take place on Game Preserves for the month of April for a two year trial. Discussion ensued on how this would be made possible this year as other regional F&GCs were potentially using differing approaches to enable this. It was noted that the start of the season is recognised as the first Saturday in May.

After discussion Mr Teal was requested to write a letter to Rathmoy Game Preserve to encourage all hunters on Game Preserves to purchase a wholeseason licence.

10. Rangitikei River Access Update

In response to Councillor Allen's request, Mr Teal gave a brief overview of actions taken in the preceding year to resolve or investigate access restrictions in the Upper Rangitikei River. This involved involving the Walking Access Commission to negotiate access agreements with NZ Defence as a primary action, and gather intelligence regarding changes to access arrangements in the area.

Councilor Allen considered as we are unlikely to change the situation we should not spend time an effort trying to improve public access to this river and that there was no legal requirement for any landholders (including NZ Defence) to allow access to anglers on their land.

Chairman Taylor considered the legislative basis for maximising recreational opportunities meant that Council should still continue to seek improved access. Chairman Taylor noted that Bruce Bates (for Ngamatea Station) had responded to NZ F&G Council via letter which referred to designated camping areas – which required further clarification.

With the next meeting being in Wellington it was requested that Ric Cullinane (Operations Manager, Walking Access Commission) be invited to give an overview of progress made.

11. <u>One Plan Update</u>

Mr Teal noted that formal mediation had continued through until the end of October and considerable effort had been made to achieve outcomes that would avoid taking issues to the Environment Court. It was almost certain that aspects of the plan regarding sections of biodiversity, land use, and water quality will not be resolved and will be heard in March/April.

Mr Teal explained that there had been some difficulty in getting suitable experts prepared to act as technical experts that had the theoretical and practical technical knowledge, and prepared to present on agricultural industry issues.

Mr Teal noted that the recent announcement that Hawke's Bay, Horizons and Greater Wellington Regional Councils, and DOC to form a strategic alliance, only serves to highlight the importance of the precedent value of the One Plan.

The Environment Court has set the timetable for the Court Hearings (starting in March), as well as the expert causing and evidence exchange that are now standard practice prior to reaching Court. These timetables are tight which has required our evidence to be prepared over the late December and early January period.

Mr Teal confirmed that he had responded to the Federated Farmers requests for legal and planners costs relating to mediation.

Councillor Allen informed Council that he had spoken to DOC about spraying the willows in the wetland and that they had been positive after meeting with Nic Cudby. They were currently measuring up areas for spraying this year and it was agreed that Fish & Game reaffirm an offer of provision of spray and helicopter time which was budgeted.

It had been reported that a causeway had been constructed between Matthews Lagoon and Boggy Pond and the culvert removed. It was confirmed that Fish & Game had offered to assist with this project but had not subsequently been approached.

The management of the weir was discussed with acknowledgement that a longer term structure or water diversion was required. While the weir boards have not been installed in December, there was high water levels reported throughout summer – which resulted in extensive waterfowl use. There was a request to install the weir boards with a view to maintain water levels from February until May.

Mr Teal confirmed that there were two sites being balloted for the Wairarapa area in mid February, along with several in Pukepuke Lagoon, Himatangi.

Fishing and Hunting Internet Forum

Councillor O'Meara had been made aware that comments had been made on an internet discussion group forum regarding decisions at a previous Council meeting. He considered that Councillor Allen had made what he regarded as derogatory comments on how Councillors had voted.

Chairman Taylor indicated that a decision had been made at that meeting where one resolution was lost and a subsequent resolution carried and accepted. Councillor Moore noted that Councillors should take collective responsibility for decisions made.

Councillor Neumann stated that it was a public meeting and as such could be reported so there was nothing wrong in that but was a 'style' issue. Chairman Taylor noted that no Council policy/rule on conduct had been broken but he would not expect Councillors to take an overly critical tone.

As there were no hard copies of the forum discussion and the exact details could not be ascertained, it was agreed to get a copy of this for the next meeting to allow the issue to be considered.

There being no further business the meeting was closed at 7.30pm.
